

HONORING MY UNCLE

My Uncle Dave and I were raised more like brother and sister than uncle and niece. That's because my grandmother gave birth to Dave exactly a year and a half before my mom had me. We were childhood playmates and we grew closer when my grandma died at age 53 when Uncle Dave was only in eighth grade.

In the early 1970's Uncle Dave and I were both students at the University of Illinois and we somehow ended up living in the same dormitory. Just when I had escaped the bondage of daily parental oversight, I now had my uncle living in the same building!

It wasn't until the early '80's when we

discovered that my uncle was gay. Someone had spotted him at a gay bar and the secret was out. I would love to say now that we all accepted Uncle Dave and his lifestyle choice without judgment but it took some time. This was during the terror of the AIDS epidemic which seemed to make it even worse. But we all loved Dave so much and as he began to open up and be honest with us about his journey, our whole family became accepting and eventually strongly supportive.

That acceptance came in no small part because of my uncle's choice of a partner, also named Dave. My uncle's partner was one of the most delightful human beings I had ever met. Handsome, witty and bright, Dave was ALWAYS the life of the party. He was so genuine and unafraid and I think he made my uncle braver too.

Uncle Dave and Dave were an absolute blast to be around. They had been a couple for more than 30 years when tragedy struck. Just a few days before Christmas in 2007, someone shot the love of my uncle's life in the head execution style. Neither his wallet nor Christmas gifts in the car were taken so

there is no doubt why Dave was killed. This was a hate crime and his killer has never been found.

So I have watched in horror the past few years as the once growing acceptance of the LGBTQ community has been decimated by the hate and violence of the bigots in our midst. I truly feel that we must find the courage to push back . . . even here in deep Red Hood County. So I bought a large Pride flag and I hung it from my front porch this morning. I am ready for the hate that may come because of it.

I love you Uncle Dave.

We Survived the 2023 88th Legislative Session: 140 Days of CRAZY

A secretive kitchen remodel, an extramarital affair, alleged corruption, gifts at a Dairy Queen, threats, and the demand by Attorney General Ken Paxton that taxpayers pay his \$3.3 million settlement to a whistleblower suit. These were the basis for 20 articles of impeachment of now- suspended Paxton's alleged misbehaviors that were reported on the floor of the Texas House on Saturday, May 27.

The Republican-lead House voted 121-23 to vote for impeachment (Hood County Rep. Shelby Slawson voting against impeachment). The current 88th Legislature is made up of 85 Republican House members and 64 Democrats. According to the Washington Post, Paxton tweeted after the vote, accusing House Speaker Dade Phelan (R) and the "corrupt politicians he controls" of colluding with Democrats, the Biden administration, "the abortion industry, anti-gun zealots and woke corporations." The attorney general is currently suspended from office and must now await a trial in the Texas Senate.

The Senate panel that will make recommendations on rules of procedure will be chaired by Sen. Brian Birdwell, R-Granbury. Seven Republicans and five Democrats make up the board of managers who will handle the prosecution in the trial. The trial will take place in the Texas Senate not later than Aug. 28. The Senate must get a two-thirds majority (21 votes) to remove Paxton from office. On May 31, Gov. Greg Abbott appointed Fort Worth lawyer and former Secretary of State John Scott as interim Texas attorney general.

Lawmakers did pass bills banning puberty blockers and hormone treatments for transgender children, allowing prosecutors to pursue murder charges against people who sell fentanyl and eliminating diversity, equity and inclusion offices on public university campuses. In addition, the legislators passed a \$321.3 billion state budget, allocating money toward tax cuts, mental health access and infrastructure for broadband and water. To help pay for the budget, they allocated half of the record \$32.7 billion surplus they had at their disposal. The House passed a bill without Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick's preferred increase to homestead exemptions – then abruptly adjourned for the special session. That basically tells the Senate to take or leave it. As of Wednesday, May 31, there are no meetings scheduled for the Senate.


